



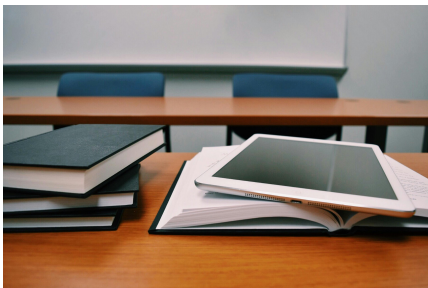
English Grammar and Literacy Course Outline



Duration: 1 Day

Course Overview and Objectives

This is a one day workshop for learners who already have a command of English grammar and want to strengthen their accuracy, fluency, and confidence. Our time will be devoted to improving sentence structure, understanding core grammar rules, building vocabulary, and developing strong reading and writing habits that align with CEFR standards (A2–C1).

Grammar and literacy form the foundation of all strong communication. This course equips learners with the practical tools they need to read with insight, write with clarity, and use English accurately across academic and everyday contexts. Through guided practice, learners explore sentence structure, punctuation, vocabulary, cohesion, and the mechanics of written language, while also strengthening the comprehension skills required to interpret texts effectively.

In addition to core grammar development, the course focuses on literacy strategies that help learners process information more critically and express themselves with confidence. Students learn how to analyse written texts, identify key ideas, summarise information, and construct well-organised written responses. By integrating grammar accuracy with active reading habits, the programme empowers learners to produce polished, meaningful writing and to engage thoughtfully with the texts they encounter across subjects and curricula.
